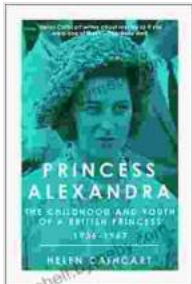

Princess Alexandra has been a tireless advocate for her charities. She has visited hospitals, schools, and care homes, and has raised millions of pounds for her chosen causes.

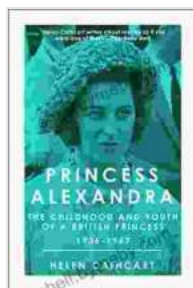

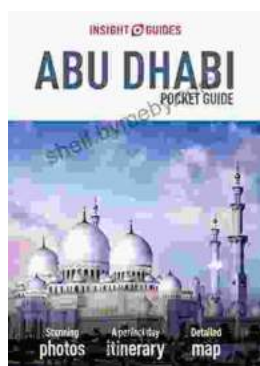

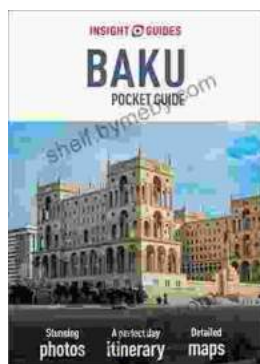
